

Glucose Control in the Perianesthesia & Perioperative Area

In the United States, over 18 million people are diabetics. That is 6.3% of the total population. And that number is growing. It is expected to double in adults and in children in the next decade. Diabetics also require surgery more often than do non-diabetics. Perianesthesia nurses are bound to care for patients with diabetes often.

Due to the enormity of the issue and its impact on patient care in the Perianesthesia area, a series of educational offerings will be presented. The first quarter presentation will examine the overall complications of hyperglycemia in the Perianesthesia and perioperative period. Goals and nursing implications will be examined in further writings.

Type I diabetes is the absolute deficiency of insulin production. Type II diabetes involves insulin resistance and some deficiency of insulin production. 90-95 % of diabetics have Type II diabetes. Type II diabetics who require insulin are likely to need higher doses of insulin than type I diabetics, due to the progressive nature of the disease (Ead, 2009).

Surgery triggers the stress response. This can increase the blood sugar in both diabetics and nondiabetics. The stress response increases the secretion of glucagon, cortisol, and epinephrine. The increased release of theses counter regulatory hormones leads to increased gluconeogenesis. Furthermore, the release of these hormones also triggers tachy-cardia, hypertension, and hyperglycemia, which then brings about the decrease in peripheral circulation. Post operative pain and nausea can put further stress on the body. This stress can also decrease the release of insulin from the Beta cells of the pancreas. The longer and more invasive the surgery, the higher the correlation to hyperglycemia. Even a minor surgery, such as a cholescystectomy, can cause hyperglycemia and insulin resistance for up to five days post op.

Complications:

Abnormal blood sugars are associated with abnormalities in granulocyte adherence, impaired phagocytosis, delayed chemotaxis, and depressed bactericidal capacity. Poorly managed glucose control can lead to several numbers of post-operative complications such as impaired would healing in both cardiac and non-cardiac patients. Hyperglycemia, especially, a blood sugar > than200, has been shown to increase the risk of postoperative wound infection and wound dehiscence which, in turn, can lead to multi organ failure.

Other complications such as cellulitis, pneumonia, urinary tract infections, and cystitis occur more frequently when the perioperative sugars are not tightly controlled. During cataract surgery, hyperglycemia can lead to an increased progression of retinopathy.

Due to the chronic nature of diabetes, complex issues can arise in the Perioperative and Perianesthesia areas. The microvascular issues include retinopathy, renal failure, and neuropathy. Macrovascular complications can include stroke and myocardial infarction. 80% of diabetics develop and die from cardiovascular diseases. Many of these are asymptomatic due to the progression of the neuropathy. Diabetics are also vulnerable for labile blood pressures perioperatively because of altered autonomic tone from the progressive autonomic neuropathy. This further increases the risk of cardiovascular incidents.

Hyperglycemic patients are also at risk for the development of fluid and electrolyte imbalances. Filtered glucose remains in the renal tubules. This glucose cannot be reabsorbed by the kidneys and thus acts as an osmotic diuretic with an increase in water loss into the urine. Dehydration will result with the need for fluid therapy. If the fluids are not closely monitored, the result can be electrolyte imbalances. The infusion of insulin and glucose can force the movement of potassium into the cell, leading to hypokalemia and cardiac arrhythmias.

Patients with hyperglycemia may also be at increased risk of clotting, DVT, and pulmonary embolus. They may also have inadequate stomach emptying and esophageal reflux disease.

An increased incidence of stiff joint syndrome occurs in diabetics with hyperglycemia because of glycosylation of joints and other tissues. Glycosylation is the enzymatic process that attaches glycans to proteins, lipids and other molecules. The resulting reduced mobility of the upper spine can lead to difficult intubation. Other perioperative complications can include left ventricular dysfunction, hemodynamic instability, renal dysfunction, stroke, and intraoperative respiratory insufficiency and arrest. *Continued on page 9*

A Bit of Life Long Learning continued

Euglycemia

Euglycemia, normal blood sugar, leads to decreased morbidity and mortality. Perioperative euglycemia provides a protection of cardiac fibers that is thought to be related to decreased oxidative stress to cardiac tissues. This protection results in a prevention of cardiac arrhythmias. Postoperatively mechanically ventilated patients require a shorter time on the ventilator if their blood sugars are better controlled intraoperatively, with IV insulin therapy.

Euglycemia provides reduced stress to renal system, less osmotic diuresis, dehydration, electrolyte imbalance, metabolic acidosis, and/or the occurrence of new onset renal failure. It also enhances overall erythropoiesis.

Optimal perioperative and PeriAnesthesia glucose control may also increase pain control. This can be the result of a decrease in the inflammatory response associated with control of glucose levels.

Next quarter, we will examine the therapeutic modalities for the treatment of hyperglycemia in the PeriAnesthesia and perioperative period.

ASPAN's Membership Campaign


