

## From the Editors Desk

"When was the last time you had anything to eat or drink?" I asked as I peered around the WOW at my admission. One of the luxuries of working in an ambulatory surgical center is that your patients are healthy for the most part. Good thing too, since the most important part of an admission these days is getting the documentation right.

I had a little personal trip to a minor emergency center today for a ...minor emergency. I filled out 11 pieces of paper before anyone ever touched me. Of those 11 pages, only one form was actually related to the state of my health.

How did we get here? Nurses are frustrated beyond measure with this "new" attitude of paperwork priority. Heaven help the facility that does not receive the blessing of Joint Commission because a box wasn't checked. Enormous fines for rule "infractions", endless pages of paperwork in our age of "computer charting", if there is a solution to a problem, it involves designing a new form. Nurse managers continue to put on a brave face and emphasize the patient comes first. and nurses fight daily to make that statement true, but the reality is quite different. And the looming question remains. Has *any* of this improved patient care?

Now I readily admit to being an old coot. You know I can wax nostalgic about the good ol' days of nursing. I was not raised in the computer generation, but drug kicking and screaming into acclimation of the brave new world. But I have watched the pendulum swing so far away from the focal patient to the focal computer/medical record, that nurses are experiencing mass motion sickness. A friend recently hospitalized lamented to me that her care was excellent, but provided entirely by CNA's. The nurses on her busy floor spent all their time "typing on their computers". Although that may not have been the whole truth, it seemed that way to the patient.



A few years ago, my prediction for the future of medicine revolved around the hope that the "powers that be" would see this was not effective in providing state of the art health care, and that health care practices would move to a more hemostatic level. Is it too late to restore common sense to medicine?
